Johann's Equipment Guide

The minimum required equipment is a sword or sword simulator such as a Shinai or a nylon waster, a fencing mask and a good pair of gloves. We also recommend neck/throat protection and a box.

Cross guard:

Wooden cross guards can be made by yourself using hickory or oak from a pickaxe handle, or buy one from Medieval Art and Woodcraft -

Weight:

A standard shinai is significantly underweight so you will need to add a 500-800g weight, fitted above the guard. You can either buy some roofing lead from a DIY shop, cut it out and roll it yourself, wrapping tape around it, or you can ask me to cast a new batch of lead rings.

'Ubershinai':
